Dacorum Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 Local Government Act 2000 and Local Authorities (Arrangements for the Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that County under sections 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 of Part I and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officers of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the aforementioned 1984 Act, makes the following Order:

**CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT**

1. This Order shall come into operation on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2023 and may be cited as 'DACORUM BOROUGH COUNCIL TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER THE BOROUGH OF DACORUM (ANCHOR LANE & BEECHFIELD ROAD, HEMEL HEMPSTEAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2023'

**INTERPRETATION**

2. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

"Carriageway" has the same meaning as in section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980

"Council" means Dacorum Borough Council and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agent appointed by and acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of any function under the provisions of this Order;

"Civil Enforcement Officer (Parking)" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and who is appointed by the Dacorum Borough Council under section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"Disabled Persons Badge" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a vehicle displaying a valid Disabled Persons Badge and Parking Disc;

“Driver”, in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place or restricted waiting area, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place or restricted waiting area;

“Dwelling” means a house or self-contained flat registered for Council Tax purposes

“Enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bylaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of enactment;

“Light Goods Vehicle” means Motor Vehicle, the maximum gross weight of which does not exceed 3.5 tonnes, which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, and is drawing a trailer

“Motor Cycle/s” has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

“Motor Vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

“Owner”, in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used and in determining who the owner of a vehicle was at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994

“Parking Disc” has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

“Passenger Vehicle/s” means a Motor Vehicle constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the Driver, and not drawing a trailer

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- (4) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled persons badge in the relevant position when it is so regarded for the purposes of Regulation 4(1) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

## **Section 1 – Prohibition of Waiting**

### **PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME**

3. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in columns 1, 2 and 3 in Schedule 1 to this Order.

### **PROHIBITION OF WAITING DURING RESTRICTED HOURS**

5. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified in columns 1, 2 and 3 during the hours specified in column 4 in Schedule 2 to this Order.

### **GENERAL EXEMPTIONS**

6. Nothing in Articles 3 & 4 shall prohibit any vehicle from waiting for as long as reasonably necessary in the following circumstances:
  - (a) The vehicle is directed to stop or wait by or with the permission of a Police Constable, or with permission of Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform
  - (b) The vehicle is being used for emergency services purposes
  - (c) To prevent a road traffic collision
  - (d) The vehicle cannot be moved due to an unavoidable breakdown

### **PROHIBITION OF WAITING EXEMPTIONS**

7. Nothing in Articles 3 & 4 shall apply to a vehicle waiting for as long as necessary in the following circumstances:
  - a) The vehicle is waiting for the purposes of loading or unloading that vehicle, provided the loading/unloading is continuous and being undertaken in a timely manner, the goods being loaded/unloaded cannot be reasonably carried other than by means of a vehicle, the vehicle is waiting adjacent to where the goods are being loaded/unloaded from/to and the length of time the vehicle is waiting for is reasonable
  - b) To allow the picking up or setting down of passengers
  - c) The vehicle is a cleaning or refuse vehicle collecting rubbish in the immediate vicinity
  - d) The vehicle is waiting for the purpose of removing an obstruction to traffic
  - e) The vehicle is a liveried utility company being used in connection with works of that utility in the immediate vicinity
  - f) The vehicle is a Disabled Persons Vehicle, provided the vehicle does not wait for longer than three hours and at least one hour has elapsed following a previous period of waiting by the vehicle in the same road or part of a road
  - g) The vehicle is displaying a valid Temporary Parking Restriction Dispensation Permit issued by the Council

### **CONTRAVENTION**

8. Any person or vehicle failing to comply with the provisions of Section 1 of this Order shall be in contravention of it and a penalty charge shall be payable.

**Section 2 – Revocations**

**REVOCATIONS**

9. In accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 of the 1984 Act, the following Orders, relating to the specific waiting restriction extents described in the schedule to this Order are to be revoked as specified in the sub-Articles that follow:

(a) The Borough of Dacorum (Controlled Parking Zones) Order 2020

Schedule 1; Waiting Restricted at any time. Cotterells Area (Zone C).

<b>STREET NAME</b>	<b>SIDE OF STREET</b>	<b>LOCATION</b>
Anchor Lane	South	From its junction with Heath Lane westwards for a distance of 13m
Anchor Lane	North	From its junction with Heath Lane westwards for a distance of 12m
Anchor Lane	South	From its junction with the east kerblines of Beaumayes Close eastwards for a distance of approximately 17m
Anchor Lane	North	From its junction with the west kerb line of Mayo Gardens westwards for a distance of approximately 5m

Schedule 4; Waiting Restricted: Monday to Friday inclusive, 8.30am to 4.30pm Cotterells Area (Zone C).

<b>STREET NAME</b>	<b>SIDE OF STREET</b>	<b>LOCATION</b>
Anchor Lane	South	From a point approximately 13m from its junction with Heath Lane westwards for a distance of approximately 20m.
Anchor Lane	North	From a point approximately 12m from its junction with Heath Lane westwards for a distance of approximately 20m.

Schedule 9; Waiting Restricted: Monday to Friday inclusive, 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm, Cotterells Area (Zone C).

<b>STREET NAME</b>	<b>SIDE OF STREET</b>	<b>LOCATION</b>
Anchor Lane	South	From its junction with Beechfield Road eastwards for a distance of approximately 32m.
Anchor Lane	North	From its junction with Beechfield Road eastwards for a distance of approximately 52m.

<b>STREET NAME</b>	<b>SIDE OF STREET</b>	<b>LOCATION</b>
Anchor Lane	Both	From its junction with Heath Lane for a distance of 34m in a westerly direction.
Anchor Lane	South	From its junction with Beechfield Road for a distance of 24m in a north easterly direction.
Anchor Lane	North	From its junction with Beechfield Road for a distance of 24m in a north easterly direction.
Anchor Lane	North	From its junction with Beechfield Road (Western side) for a distance of 17m in a westerly direction.
Beechfield Road	West	From its junction with Anchor Lane (Western side) for a distance of 59m in a northerly direction.
Beechfield Road	East	From its junction with Anchor Lane (Eastern side) for a distance of 22m in a northerly direction.
Beechfield Road	East	From its junction with Anchor Lane (Eastern side) for a distance of 71m in a southerly direction.
