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New Comic Relief Grants Programme

Red Nose Day UK Programme (2009-12)

Following the review of its grant making programme, Comic Relief has recently announced that it is now accepting applications for grants through its **Red Nose Day Programmes (2009 -12)**. Comic Relief are keen to make sure that their funding reaches all parts of the UK, especially areas which often miss out, such as rural communities.

Grants are currently available through the following programme areas:

- Mental Health
- Domestic and Sexual abuse
- Refugee and Asylum Seeking Women
- Sport for Change
- Young people aged between 11 and 25
 - Sexually Exploited and Trafficked Young people
 - Young People and Alcohol
 - Young people with Mental Health Problems
- Local Communities

Comic Relief has also announced two new programmes coming soon in the areas of:

- Young Carers (managed by the Princess Royal Trust for Carers)
- Older People.

There are no minimum or maximum grants in most of these programmes, but on average grants are of between £25,000 and £40,000 per year. Funding can be used to cover:

- Running costs
- Capital costs.

Building costs, generally, are given a very low priority, and they will only fund these in exceptional circumstances.

Grant funding is available to a wide range of community and voluntary organisations including:

- constituted voluntary and community groups
- charities
- social enterprises
- co-operatives
- faith organisations
- community interest companies.

Applications are assessed quarterly and the next deadline is the 24th July 2009.

Comic Relief Small Grants Available Through Herts Community Foundation

Hertfordshire Community Foundation (along with other foundations across the UK) is now inviting applications for grants up to £10,000 that they are distributing on behalf of Comic Relief. These 'small grants' will be available up to 31 March 2011.

Community groups, residents associations, community centres, social enterprises, Community Interest Companies and credit unions working in a disadvantaged or deprived area are eligible to apply for a grant for a range of activities that will;

- increase access to sport and exercise for people who face social exclusion and isolation
- help people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives to regain their confidence and self-esteem
- build the skills of local people
- increase community cohesion
- respond to local economic needs

Equality and Human Rights Commission has launched its Strategic Funding Programme **Ch SE VC** [LA eligible as a partner]

The Equality and Human Rights Commission has launched its Strategic Funding Programme available to organisations offering legal advice on equality and human rights issues. The funding programme is primarily aimed at projects providing specialist legal advice and representation in equality and human rights. The Commission is also particularly keen to fund activity where there is currently no provision or access to advice, as well as to projects which promote awareness and understanding of equality and human rights laws. The fund will cover two main areas. The provision of legal advice, casework and representation to individuals about matters falling within the Equality and Human Rights enactments and raising awareness and knowledge of equality and human rights. The maximum available funding for a single organisation is £150,000 per year and projects providing advice, casework and representation may be funded for up to three years. **The deadline for applications for legal projects is 5pm, August 7th, 2009.**

Creating a cleaner and healthier environment

One Planet Living Grant Scheme **Ch VC**

Through the OPL Grant scheme, schools, community groups and charitable organisations can apply to their local B&Q store for funding to support a local community project. Projects must support at least one of the following themes:

- Environment/Energy Saving
- Natural Habitats/Wildlife
- Local Culture/Heritage.

The scheme provides £50 to £250 (at retail cost) of B&Q materials, for example, pond liners, plants, peat-free compost for projects such as a pond/wildlife garden or paints labelled low or minimal VOC for redecoration projects.

GreenPrints **Ch VC**

A partnership of five of the country's leading not-for-profit organisations have come together to provide support and funding to help young people improve green spaces in our communities. SITA Trust, the youth volunteering charity, BTCV, The Wildlife Trusts and the BBC's Breathing Places campaign, have joined forces to develop a two-year programme called GreenPrints which will offer funding of up to £10,000, as

well as support and practical expertise from the partners, to enable 16-25 year olds to make a real difference to the communities in which they live. The funding is open to not for profit organisations for projects designed and delivered by groups of volunteers aged 16 to 25. SITA Trust and v have each pledged £1 million to fund the programme, making it one of the largest single investments made by either organisation to any funding programme. The overall programme will be managed using the expertise and experience of SITA Trust and BTCV. One of the most unusual elements of this programme is the individual, dedicated mentor-support that will be provided by the BTCV and The Wildlife Trusts to assist with the practical delivery of every single project that is supported. **The next application deadline is the 12th August 2009.**

E.ON Sustainable Energy Fund Ch VC

E.ON the power and gas generating and distributing company has announced the launch of a new Sustainable Energy Fund. The E.ON Sustainable Energy Fund offers grants of up to £20,000 to community groups and not for profit organisations who wish to consider and implement sustainable energy projects in their buildings. Projects that can be considered include; the purchase and installation of one or more renewable energy technologies (e.g. wind, solar thermal, PV, wood etc); the renovation of existing facilities to incorporate micro-generation technology (e.g. the reinstatement of a watermill and the purchase of a turbine to produce hydro-electricity); an energy efficiency makeover for your building that could demonstrate significant energy savings and also behavioural change amongst users; and the use of new or innovative technology to deliver either energy savings or micro-generation capacity. To be eligible organisations must benefit specific community groups namely: Young people; Elderly people; and People in fuel poverty. **The next closing date for applications is the 16th October 2009.**

Free distance learning course for volunteers In

The Certificate in Interpersonal Skills for Volunteers, run by the University of Wales, Lampeter has helped hundreds of people over the years improve their interpersonal skills. You don't need to be a volunteer to take advantage of this course, everybody can benefit from improved interpersonal skills. At the moment the course is available **free of charge** for UK and EU residents who do not hold (and are not currently studying for) a degree or higher qualification. Simply use the promotional code LAMP99 when applying online at www.volstudy.ac.uk. Students who do already have a degree can also use this code and save £99 reducing the fees to £199. The course is part-time distance learning with no exams. It has monthly start dates and the course is fully accredited by the University of Wales and can lead to a BA Degree in Voluntary Sector Studies. New Fund to Assist Market Towns

Action for Market Towns (AMT), the national membership group representing the interest of Market Towns, has announced the launch of a new grant scheme to help towns share their good ideas and practical projects with each other. The Towns-4-Towns Fund Best Practice Transfer Fund will provide grants of between £100 and £500 to transfer good practice in regenerating market towns. All applications should be joint applications. They must include one 'Tutor' town (who will share and transfer their successful scheme) and one 'Learner' town (who will take on the scheme). At least one of the towns must be a Premium Town Member of AMT. The Towns-4-Towns fund will cover 40% of your project costs. AMT need evidence that

you can bring in the 60% match funding to make the scheme transfer a success.

This has been launched by the Learning and Skills Council and the European Social Fund. Its aim is to support third sector organisations who are working with people who face barriers to the labour market or to mainstream skills provision. European Social fund will support a range of activities which assist unemployed or economically inactive people in the East of England to move closer to main stream skills provision. Small voluntary and community organisations are invited to apply for grants of up to £12,000. They can use the grant to work with people who are unemployed or economically inactive aged 16 years or older. Village SOS Ch VC SE

The Big Lottery Fund (BIG) together with the BBC have announced the launch of Village SOS, a new initiative that is searching for up to six villages with a great business idea and six enterprising individuals to act as Village Champions and help them achieve their ambitions. Invited to apply are all types of voluntary and community organisations such as:

- charities
- community organisations
- social enterprises
- village and community based co-operatives.

They must represent:

- rural villages across the UK with fewer than 3,000 people that have an idea for a new business that could bring energy and life back into the community.

The final six projects will share up to £3 million and will take part in a major prime time BBC One series, launched as a Learning Campaign to support more villages to develop their idea. **The deadline for applications is the 14th August 2009.**

New Youth Music fund launched Ch VC

Youth Music launched its new funding programme on 30 June 2009, for music projects providing music-making activities to children aged zero to 18. Applications will be via its first ever online application form and grants for between £5,000 and £30,000 will be available to projects running for six to 24 months. The fund is available to projects that provide structured, regular and progressive music-making activities for children and young people in support of Youth Music's three goals of:

- working with Early Years,

- Children and Young People in challenging circumstances and
- Encouraging Talent.

To be eligible, projects will need to work with children and young people aged zero to 18 years (or up to 25 if they have special educational needs, disabilities or are in detention) and children and young people will be at the heart of the decision making for all projects. The fund will support and promote innovation, partnership working and workforce development. www.youthmusic.org.uk

Arts Council Launches Grant Scheme to Help Arts Organisations Through Recession **Ch VC**

The Arts Council England has announced that its new £40 million grant scheme Sustain is now open for applications. Sustain is the Arts Council England's response to the impact of the recession on arts organisations whose sustainability is important in delivering their mission of great art for everyone. Sustain provides grants to arts organisations to help them maintain their artistic, financial and organisational viability during the recession and implement essential changes to ensure their long-term sustainability. Sustain will make one-off awards between £75,000 to £3 million (unless there are exceptional circumstances) to cover the period 2009-2011 and spending must commence within 12 months of the award being granted. Potential uses for Sustain funding include; resolving cash flow problems; maintaining the quality of artistic output; purchasing essential capital assets; continuing education, community and audience development work; completing building repairs and renewals ; and developing necessary organisational capability. Cash 4 Clubs (new!)

Sports club that are registered with their sport's National Governing Body or local authority can apply for grants of up to £1,000 through the Cash 4 Clubs grants scheme. Cash 4 Clubs is a sports funding scheme which gives clubs a unique chance to apply for grants to improve facilities, purchase new equipment, gain coaching qualifications, and generally invest in the sustainability of their club. In 2008 over £30,000 was given out in grants to 30 community sports clubs across the UK. There are three tiers of grants at £250, £500 and £1,000. Previous grants have been awarded to the Southampton Canoe club which received a grant of £1,000 towards purchasing junior paddles and safety equipment; the Rugby Sea Cadets which received a grant of £1,000 to maintain and replace safety equipment; and Ipswich Basketball which received a grant of £1,000 to initiate a new women's team aimed at the 16+ league. **Applications can be submitted at any time and grants are awarded on a quarterly basis.**

MLA Announces Two New Grant Schemes **Ch VC**

The Museums, Libraries, Archives Council (MLA) has announced that it has two new grants programmes that are now open to applications from museums, libraries and archives across England. The two programmes are; The Literature & Storytelling Phase 2 scheme and the Young Cultural Creator scheme. The Literature & Storytelling Phase 2 scheme has 27 grants of £750 available to enable families to learn together using museum, library and archive collections. Funding will pay for the delivery of family storytelling events across England, which will support audiences to engage with collections in new ways. The Young Cultural Creator scheme has 27 grants of £750 to £1,000 available for museums, libraries and archives working in partnership with students to create poetry inspired by collections. Funding will pay for projects that will build the capacity of cultural services to deliver social and learning outcomes to vulnerable young people. Schemes will take place between October 2009 and February 2010.

They will work with groups of young people outside mainstream education or at risk of exclusion - from Pupil Referral Units and other Children's Services. **The closing date for applications is the 19th July 2009.**

MLA Launches New Learning Challenge Fund Ch VC

The Museums, Libraries and Archives Council (MLA) has announced that a new Challenge Fund to promote adult informal learning is now available to museums, libraries and archive venues in England. The Museums, Libraries and Archives Council (MLA) is looking for partnership bids with self-organised groups of adult learners to support them in the use of our spaces and resources in new ways. Museums, libraries and archives may apply for grants of up to £5000 from a pot of £100,000. The minimum that organisations can apply for is £500 for projects to be delivered by end March 2010. The MLA Challenge Fund is highlighted in the Learning Revolution White Paper as part of the implementation of a new informal adult learning movement. It is intended to encourage museums, libraries and archives to develop new approaches to partnership working and could fund; the purchase of equipment to support the self-organised group/s to make use of the collection (e.g. a camera/projector); waiving room hire charges; the development of workshops using the museum, library or archive collection; an exhibition or learning event in the museum, library or archive space; and ' or the development of a publication, etc. **The deadline for applications is noon on the 17th July 2009.**

Sport England Innovation Fund Ch VC SE LA

Sport England has announced that its new Innovation Fund is now open for applications. The overall aim of this £5 million grants programme is to invest in new ideas which will reach a whole new audience, and provide better, more exciting sports opportunities to a wider range of people, some of whom, perhaps, think that sport is not for them. Grants of between £10,000 and £500,000 will be available to sports clubs, voluntary or community organisations, local authorities, education establishments (such as schools, colleges and universities) and national governing bodies of sport. Grants will be awarded to small-scale but groundbreaking innovative projects that have the ability to become the scaled-up, widespread activities that deliver high quality community sport in future years. Sport England is looking to support between 10 and 20 projects and there is a two stage application process. **The closing date for stage 1 of the application process is 5 pm on the 10th August and applicants will be notified of the outcome in October 2009.**

The BIG Family Idea

The Big Lottery Fund in partnership with National Family Week is inviting people of all ages in the UK to enter the BIG Family Idea competition, with an idea that could improve family life, either in their street or revolutionises life for families throughout the UK. The idea could aim to change government legislation; help disadvantaged families; encourage a healthier family lifestyle; or enhance communication between family members. There are no restrictions on the size of the idea, and this could be a product; service; event; campaign; or a great social idea. BIG will provide £150,000 of Big Lottery Fund to an organisation who can develop the winning idea. An example of a great idea includes; The Walking Bus. There's a driver at the front and a conductor at the back (specially trained parents), it takes the same route to school every day picking the kids up along the way. **The closing date for entries is the 31st July 2009.**

The Guardian Charity Awards 2009 Ch

The Guardian Charity Awards 2009, sponsored by Media and the National Council of voluntary Organisations, are open to UK social welfare charities that can demonstrate excellence and achievement in what they do. Eligible charities must also have been registered in the UK for more than two years and have an annual income of between £5,000 and £1 million. The awards offer a leg-up to organisations that are delivering practical solutions to present-day problems, especially in today's challenging economic circumstances. Each winner will receive £1,000 cash, a PC and a range of consultancy and media advice. Previous winners include; Action for Sustainable Living - a Manchester-based community charity that encourages people to change their lifestyles and live more sustainable; Envision - a group set up by young people to engage other young people in social and environmental volunteering; and Straight Talking Peer Education - a group that works both to tackle Britain's high rates of teenage pregnancy and to empower and support teenage parents. **The deadline for entries is the 31st July 2009 and winners will be announced in December.** <http://www.guardian.co.uk/charity-awards-2009>

Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust Grants Making Programme Ch

The Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust awards grants to charitable organisations in the United Kingdom and overseas. The trustees welcome applications for projects within the following areas for the next three years. These categories are then repeated in a three-year rotation. **2009 Community & Disability (Deadline for applications: 1st Nov 2009)**; 2010 Children; Youth; The Elderly; Medical (Deadline for applications: 1st June & 1st Nov 2010); 2011 Music and the Arts; Overseas (Deadline for applications: 1st June & 1st Nov 2011); Please note that, for 2010, only Medical Research projects dealing with the ageing population will be considered. The other priorities - Children, Youth and the Elderly - as well as other non-research based medical work are still welcome. If your charity's work falls within one of these categories and would like to be considered for a grant, please submit an application by 1st June or 1st November only in the appropriate year. Grants are usually between £1,000 and £10,000, with the majority being £5,000 or less. Exceptionally, grants of up to £20,000 are made, but these are usually for medical research projects. Previous grants awarded include a grant of £5,000 towards a resource centre providing advice and training for workers dealing with mental health in rural areas and £5,000 towards a project aimed at behavioural programme for persistent young offenders.

TalkTalk's Innovation In The Community Awards Ch VC

TalkTalk's Innovation in the Community Awards enable charity and community groups throughout the UK to harness the power of the Internet. This year's awards will be **open for applications from the 1st July to the 30th September 2009**. Through the awards 30 cash prizes of £2000 are available. Five overall winners will receive an additional £250 of technology equipment. Talk Talk are keen to fund any technology project which extends the work of the organisation concerned. Previous winners include Street League, a nationwide charity using football as a means of getting disadvantaged people into work and education. Participants in its training sessions and competitive football leagues, also complete sports-themed modules in CV- writing, job searching and personal development. Street League will use its award to redevelop its website to create a social networking facility for site users, and increase the uptake of IT training. Aspire helps people with spinal cord injuries to access computers through specialist equipment in hospitals and at home. The grant will go towards helping even more people get online, however severe their injuries.

Big Challenge Ch VC In

UnLtd, has announced that the year 2 of the Big Challenge competition will be launched on the 4th July 2009. The Big Challenge is a competition for young people funded by Vodafone and youth charity "V", along with social enterprise foundation and competition organisers UnLtd. The contest offers either groups of young people or those working on their own aged between 16 and 25 the chance to win a share of £60,000 funding to carry out projects that use volunteering to help tackle the problems facing the 21st century. Individuals can apply on their own or in a group with other young people. Applications can be submitted in any creative format and will be shortlisted by UnLtd Youth Leadership Team before a final vote by the public. Successful applicants will get part of the Challenge fund they will have their project costs paid for and support and mentoring over the rest of the Challenge year to make their ideas a reality. On the 4th July the Youth Leadership Team will make their decision about this year's most pressing issue for the Big Challenge to address. .

Beacon Radio has teamed up with the v Charity to fund young volunteering opportunities in the community. £50,000 is available to fund activities / projects that can put forward proposals to engage young people, aged 16-25 to volunteer in new and creative projects that will benefit the community. Not for profit and non state funded organisation can apply for up to £10,000. The aim is to inspire a new generation of young volunteers to get involved in volunteering and community action. Projects can be taster or short-term sessions that enable young people to get a flavour of volunteering and a sense of its potential value to themselves and their local community. vcashpoint Re-opens for Applications from Young Volunteers In

v, the independent charity set up to encourage young people to volunteer, has announced that the 5th funding round of its vcashpoint scheme is now open for applications. Working in partnership with the HSBC bank, vcashpoint is a £1 million initiative that will provide grants of up to £2,500 to young people to set up their own volunteering projects within their community. The type of activities that could be supported could include; running activities for children; transforming a community space; supporting victims of bullying; running workshops for young people; setting up a local campaign; clearing up a beach; running music art or sports events for disadvantaged people; and organising a festival to bring different cultures or communities together, etc. Examples of young people receiving support through vcashpoint include; Valentina Wong, 24 from North West London, who was awarded a vcashpoint grant of £2,500 for her project, "CY on Air". Aimed at 16–25 year olds, CY o! n Air provides young British Chinese people with role models and training in the skills they need to pursue careers in broadcasting; and Michelle Brodie, 21, and Laura Stanley, 22, received a grant from vcashpoint for their "Food, Farming & Fairtrade" project which enables children from two primary schools in Oldham to find out more about the countryside and where food comes from. **The next application deadline is 12 noon on the 17th August 2009.**

Social Enterprise Investment Fund Opens for Business SE

Futurebuilders England has announced that the next round of funding under the Social Enterprise Investment Fund (SEIF) is now open for applications. The SEIF provides investment to help both new and existing social enterprises grow and

improve their services in the delivery of innovative health and social care services. The Fund was set up in 2007 as part of the Government's plans for stimulating expansion in the role of social enterprise in the provision of health and social care. The Fund is managed by Futurebuilders in partnership with Partnerships UK, on behalf of the Department for Health. The Fund has helped more than 150 social enterprises by investing over £20 million since it was first launched in 2007. There is more than £70 million still available. The Social Enterprise Investment Fund provides loans and grants as well as business support. Social enterprises that can apply to SEIF include; multi-agency partnerships, particularly voluntary and community groups wishing to use their expertise to provide services across health and social care; existing social enterprises looking to expand into health and social care; and groups of professionals. Applications can be submitted at any time.

Funding to Develop Mental Health Anti-Discrimination Projects

Mind the Mental Health charity has announced that it will be making grants of around £2,500 to individuals and groups with direct experience of mental distress the opportunity to get their own mental health anti-discrimination projects up and running. Mind will be selecting 16 groups or individuals to become an Open Up Initiative (2 in each region of England) and work with them over a period of one year. The scheme helps people to get their Initiatives up and running by providing funding towards expenses plus training, mentoring and promotions support.
