

Apprenticeship data

What is the public sector target?

The public sector target was introduced in April 2017 and applies to any public sector employer with at least 250 employees. The target requires public sector employers to employ an average of 2.3% of their organisation's headcount as new apprentice starts each year between 1 April 2017 and 31 March 2021.
